Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award 2025/26

Dear Parent / Carer,

Great Marlow School are offering the year 9 students the opportunity to participate in the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE). **On Wednesday 15th October, the students will have the opportunity to attend an information session about the award during Registration**, which will detail the benefits and requirements of the bronze level programme.

About the DofE

The DofE is non-competitive and open to *all* young people – it's about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries. There are three levels of DofE programme which, when successfully completed, can lead to a Bronze, Silver, and Gold Award levels.

Through DofE, students will develop core life skills such as confidence, resilience, resourcefulness, readiness, and responsibility. All of which, will contribute to your son / daughter's development toward adulthood. Moreover, the students will gain significant employability skills, like problem-solving, team-working, and self-motivation – and they'll achieve an award which is recognised internationally by employers and educational institutions.

To achieve their Bronze Award, participants must complete four sections: Skills, Volunteering, Physical and an Expedition.

Every young person's DofE programme is personal to them – they can choose what they'd like to do for their sections, and there is a huge number of potential activities to choose from. As a centre, we will provide guidance and support on this, as well as facilitate many onsite opportunities which can contribute to the respective sections.

Activities for each section take a minimum of one hour a week over a set period of time, so they can fit around studying, hobbies and social lives. For more details about programmes and timescales look at the school website, or visit the DofE website: www.dofe.org

About the expedition

The Expedition section is made up of the **training and practice days**, followed by the **qualifying expedition**. To complete this, the students work as part of a small team who are responsible for the navigation of a planned route, cooking for themselves, as well as campcraft skills for an overnight stay. During training and practice, the students receive a significant amount of guidance from highly qualified staff. For the qualifying, the students are supported and monitored, however, they must demonstrate independence and self-

sufficiency to pass this section, this means that there are times when they are unsupervised. We aim for the programme to be inclusive of all students, as far as is possible, regardless of need.

This year, to facilitate our expedition, GMS PE staff will be accompanied by Action Adventure Pursuits, an experienced expedition company which the school has used in previous years. Currently, the proposed plan for the expedition is walking and the dates are as follows.

Training and Practice weekend: Group 1 Fri 8th Sat 9th May 2026 / Group 2 Fri 5th Sat 6th June 2026

Qualifying expedition: Group 1 Sat 16th Sun 17th May 2026 / Group 2 Sat 13th Sun 14th June 2026

Students will be expected to catch up on all schoolwork missed.

The cost for the Action Adventure Pursuits expedition package is £320, which includes the hire and use of specialist camping and navigation equipment that will be needed for the experience, as well as food for both weekends (should they choose to have it). As this is a residential trip which is directly associated with GMS, behavioural expectations and sanctions in line with school policies still apply. Details regarding all necessary kit / equipment and the payment schedule will follow in the new year.

This year, students will not be allowed on any of the Training & Practice or Qualifying Expeditions if the full DofE amount it is not paid according to the schedule. Unfortunately, our leniency in previous years regarding payments has proven costly to both the school and the DofE funds.

If GMS students do not want to use our Training / Practice / Qualifying Expedition dates, they can use the 'Opportunity Finder' on the DofE website to find an Approved Activity Provider (AAP) offering an expedition package which suits them.

Students are required by the Duke of Edinburgh's conditions to attend all the expedition training and to have demonstrated the required level of competence and behaviour in order to be able to participate in the final assessed expedition.

eDofE and the DofE app

Participants can create their DofE programme and record their progress for the 4 sections using eDofE, the DofE's digital system, available online at eDofE.org and through the DofE app – downloadable for free.

If your son / daughter decides to enrol, we will set up their eDofE account and they will receive details of how to sign in and get started.

Signing up

The cost of registering for the Bronze level of the DofE Award at GMS is £30 per participant, payable via WisePay. This is additional to the cost for the Training & Practice & Qualifying Expeditions. You must also complete an MS Consent Form, which also can be found on WisePay. Deposit payment and MS Form completion is needed before 7th November 2025. This covers your son / daughter's participation place, Welcome Pack, and Licensed Organisation fee. The Welcome Pack will be sent to their home address and includes their personalised DofE Discount Card.
