# How not to choose...

You should not choose a subject because:

- You've heard it's easy
- Somebody else wants you to do it
- You like the teacher
- Your friend says they're doing it



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# How to choose...

**1. Enjoyment:** Choose subjects you think you will enjoy. This means researching content closely and asking teachers and others who know you well for advice.

**2. Aptitude:** Choose subjects you think you will be good at - you will be more likely to enjoy them as well!

**3. Prospects:** Think seriously about future ambitions. If you already have a career in mind, check entry requirements for specific courses at university or internships and work back from there.

**4. Balance:** If you have no idea what you want to do in the future make sure that your options provide a broad and balanced programme.

**5. Independence:** Don't choose based on what friends are doing or based on favourite teachers. Make your own decisions!



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# The English Baccalaureate

- This is a school's GCSE performance indicator which measures the percentage of students that achieve 5+ grades 5-9 in a specific group of subjects
- In the first option choice students will choose one of the following: **French, Spanish, History, Geography or Computer Science**
- Students have free choice with their remaining 3 options – which may include subjects above



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# Optional Curriculum- 40%



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1. Pupils choose a total of **4** option subjects
2. Pupils choose one option from the 4 top choices and three choices from the bottom box
3. You will also select 2 reserve choices in case your original choices cannot be accommodated into the timetable

# Core Curriculum- 60%

- English Language GCSE

- Core PE (not examined)
- Core RSHE (not examined)



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# Design & Technology

Students can choose **one** Design and Technology subject:

- **Resistant Materials**
- **Graphics**
- **Textiles**

All Design & Technology subjects involve lots of practical work!

Students should consider their skill level when selecting an option.



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# Food Related Options

We also offer either:

- **Food Preparation and Nutrition GCSE** (more academic)
- **Hospitality and Catering Level 1&2** (one course covers level 1 and level 2- more vocational)

*If students are considering a Food Technology course OR a combination of D&T and Food Technology, then we recommend a discussion with Mr N Taylor prior to selection.*

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# TOP TIPS FOR Choosing the right GCSEs

1. **Read** the Options Booklet carefully.
2. **Parents/Carers** - Any subject specific questions please contact the relevant teachers or HoDs.
3. **Do not** make decisions based on friendship groups!
4. **Students** – Communication is key! Speak to your subject teachers/form tutors and family.
5. **Consider** recent progress report data.
6. **Ask yourself** - What do you enjoy? Choose subjects that are engaging and enjoyable!
7. **Careers** - Are there certain careers that need specific qualifications from certain subjects?

- **Options choices affect the next 2 years and beyond**
- **DO NOT RUSH THE PROCESS!**

**JAN- FEB:** Students given presentations from the option subject Heads of Departments; these are delivered during lesson or tutor time.
