




Seeking to address the decline in reading enjoyment, GMS are delighted to be supporting this initiative with many events focussing on integrating reading with daily life.





Our whole school will be involved in activities linked to literature and reading throughout the week. Do look out for the programme of events and encourage students to attend at least one of the many to choose from.




Drop Everything and Read
