Vision and Values

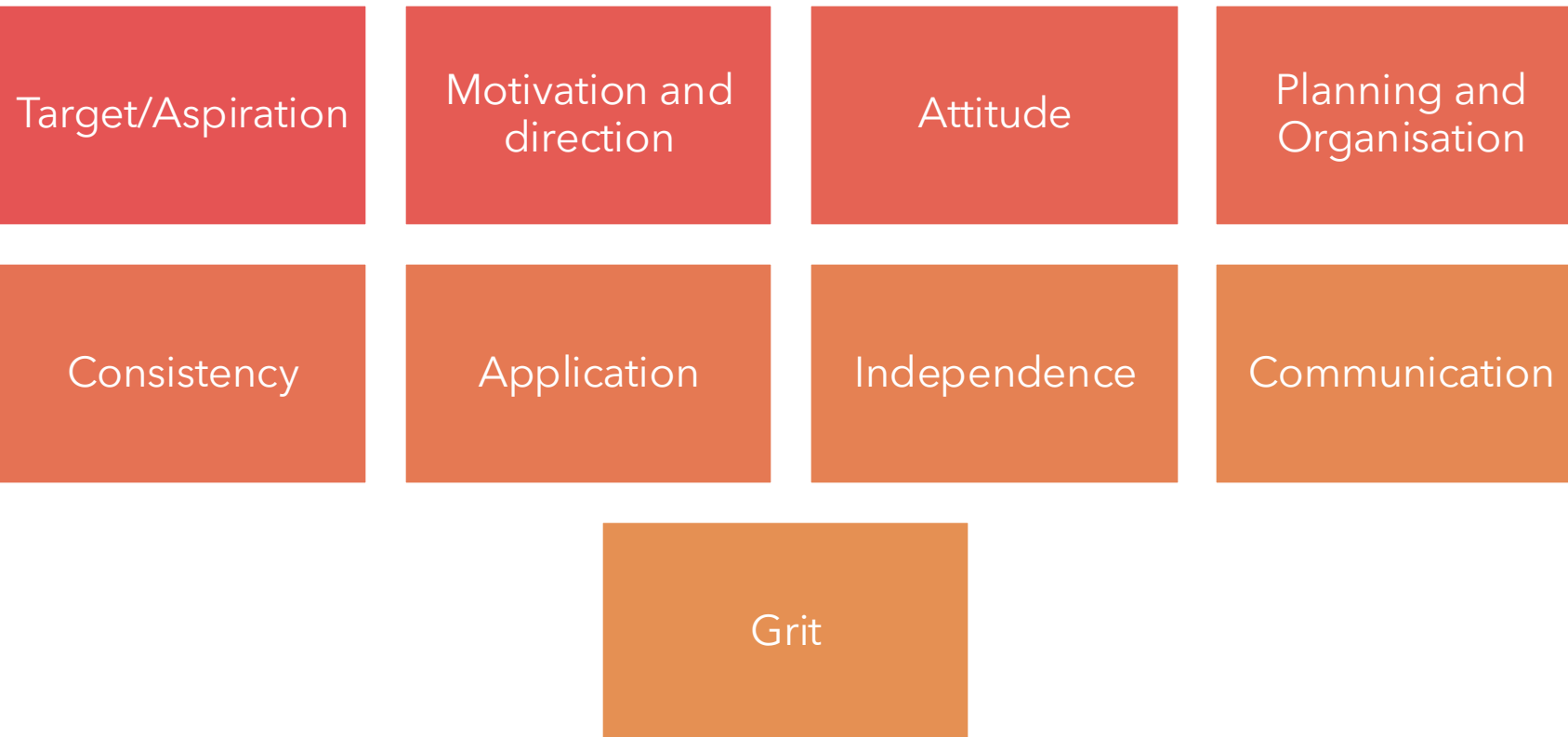
Ultimate aim: To ensure all students can access their post-19 pathways, maintain a positive ATL and achieve their best in their year 13 examinations.

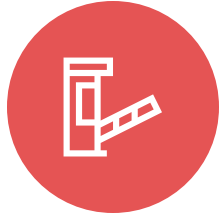
